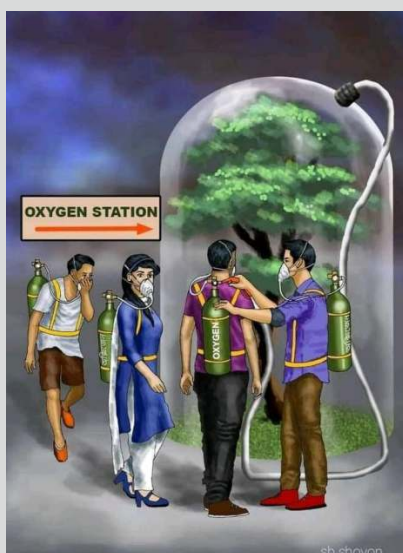

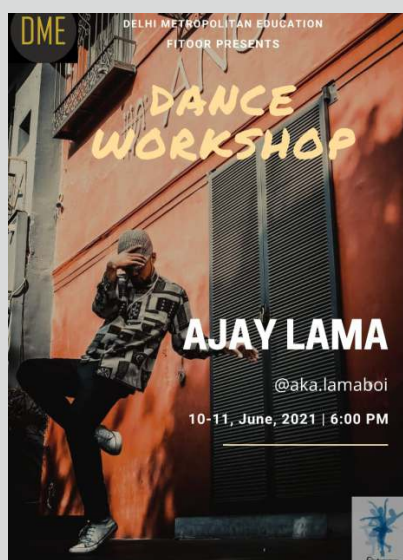

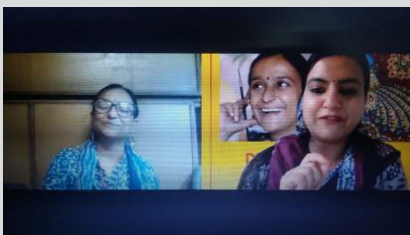

SPECTRUM

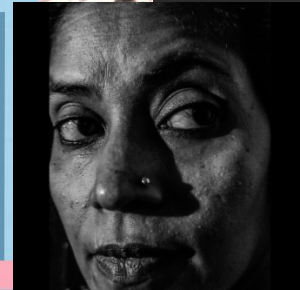
