Two days Legal Aid Camp organized by the Legal Aid Clinic, DME at Hoshiarpur Village, Gautam Buddh Nagar

In pursuance of DME's commitment towards the aspiration of free Legal Aid for all underprivileged, the Legal Aid Clinic, DME Law School organised a legal aid camp in our adoptee village of Hoshiarpur. The survey team of students and faculty members scouted the entire village of Hoshiarpur to collect data samples and potential cases to be forwarded to the District Legal Services Authority, Noida. The data was collected from the village to ascertain the specific litigious areas for the villagers so that targeted legal aid can be provided. This survey did not only have juridical value but was also helpful for academic purposes.

Apart from identifying and zeroing in on the specific cases which are in urgent need to be provided with free legal aid, the survey team also managed to unearth some extremely pressing issues of the village and a host of hotspots of both research and litigious actions for social welfare. Some of them are as follows:

1. Diminished care towards basic amenities by the bureaucratic system:

Sitting amidst high-rise buildings, with a metro line just around the corner, Hoshiarpur is a forgotten village caught between uber development and mega projects. Most of the villagers complained about the lax attitude of the government officials towards the basic needs of the village, such as clean water, cleanliness and waste management, sewage management, roads, primary medical care etc. In a lengthy interaction of the survey team with the members of the village Panchayat and the village elders, the survey found that these issues form a major problem for all individuals in the village.

2. Renaming of Sector 51 Metro Station as Hoshiarpur Metro Station:

Identity remains one of the most crucial aspects of any given community. Another demand from the village was the need to give due recognition to the village of Hoshiarpur in public landmarks. After all, it was on this village's acquired land that

the ultra-development of sector 51 happened. This also presents a wonderful opportunity to file a PIL to address the villagers' demands.

3. Compensations in lieu of the acquisition of land remain to be unsatisfactory:

The survey team managed to unearth a peculiarity that several villagers had yet to receive the promised compensation concerning the land acquired from them. Several villagers wanted more than the amount of compensation granted to them. This presents us with an excellent opportunity to conduct empirical research to understand the actualities behind the practice of land acquisition and the problems in the idea of well-informed consent and compensations.

4. Issues of identification:

Several villagers could not avail various government schemes such as the old age pension scheme (vaya vandana yojana), widow pension scheme, and maternity benefit scheme (maatru vandana yojana) etc., of lack of proper identification. Several villagers, especially the women, did not possess valid identification proof.

The Legal Aid Clinic of DME follows a two-pronged approach in pursuance of its social commitment to the cause of free legal aid, firstly providing people with free legal aid, and, secondly, spreading legal awareness to the masses. Apart from collecting data, the survey team also visited the school for the underprivileged run by the NGO Om Foundation to hold a legal awareness camp for students and parents on a designated day. With this, the two-day Legal Aid Clinic camp and survey came to a fruitful end.

Blood Donation Camp

A blood donation camp was organized on October 1, 2019, at Delhi Metropolitan Education in Nelson Mandela Auditorium, collaborating with the National Thalassemia Welfare Society and Lady Hardinge Medical College. Director, Dr. Ravi Kant Swami was a source of great encouragement by being the first donor.

The auditorium was abuzz with young students, faculty members and senior dignitaries having conversations with each other, happy to be able to play their part in lending a helping hand to people suffering from thalassemia. Thalassemia is a blood disorder passed down through families (inherited) in which the body makes an abnormal form or inadequate amount of haemoglobin. Haemoglobin is the protein in red blood cells that carries oxygen, and the disorder destroys many red blood cells, leading to anaemia.

A great number of participation was seen from all three schools Law, Management and Media. A record-breaking 115 people turned up, from which 74 donors donated their blood. Before the blood collection, there was a blood sample collection to state whether or not a person was fit to donate blood by checking their haemoglobin levels. Blood donors were provided with bananas, biscuits and frooti to re-energize them. The Community Connect Society of DME coordinated the program.
