### **Holi ke Rang Community ke Sang**

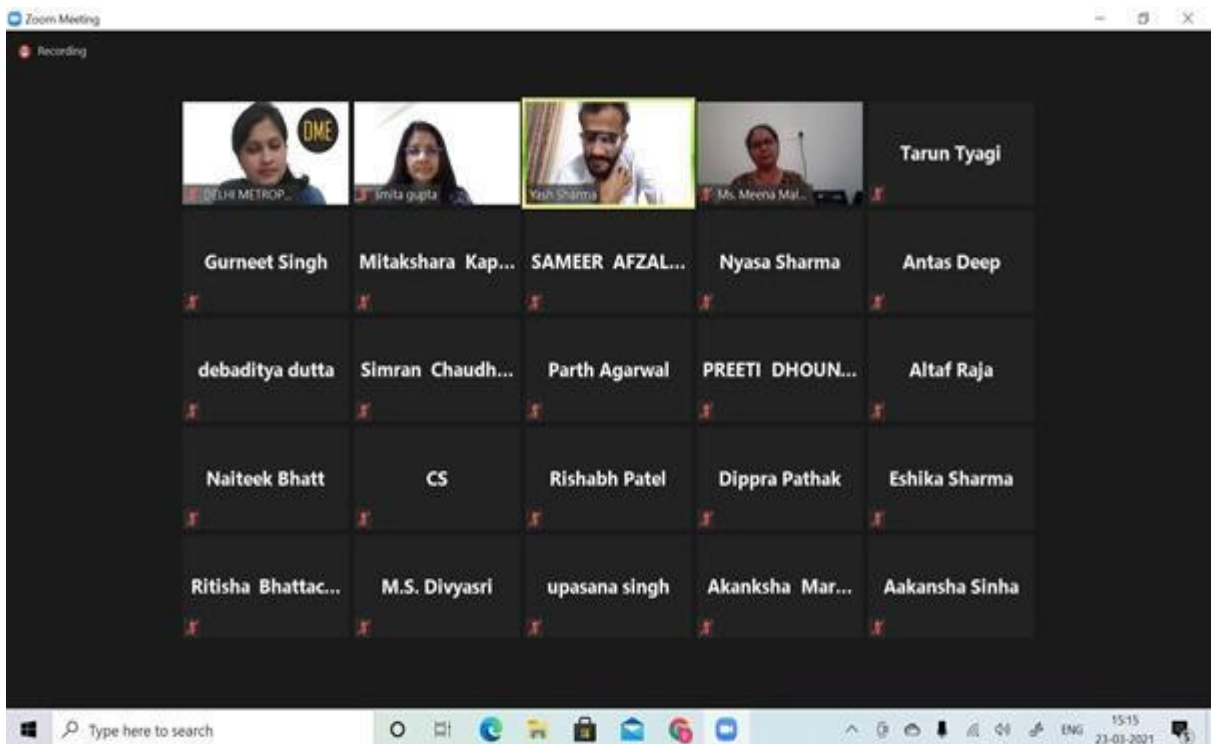
Community Connect Cell, DME celebrated “Holi ke Rang community ke Sang” on the occasion of holi.

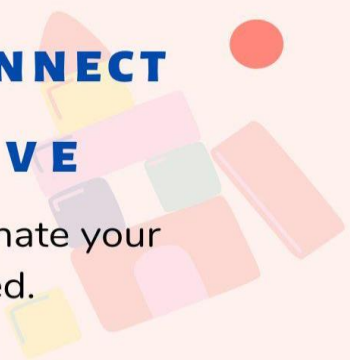
With the intention to help underprivileged children, DME came up with the idea to conduct a donation drive for the toys available for them, collecting them at one spot and later on distributing them among needy ones.

### **Showcasing Sustainable Innovations**

Community Connect Cell, DME organized a virtual event, “Showcasing Sustainable Innovations on the Zoom platform, to share knowledge and ideas for building a sustainable society. The need of society in contemporary times is to contribute to saving the environment. Community Connect Society considers its social responsibility to initiate saving Mother Earth; therefore, this event was conceptualized.

The event was organized as a platform for discussion and sharing sustainable ways and meant to create a sustainable society. It was an open forum for sharing and discussing ideas which we can imbibe in our daily lives. Students participated and presented their ideas, while many shared better sustainable ideas promoted by others in society. We learned about ideas that many of us are already doing and contributing to building an environmentally friendly society.

Some of the ideas shared were: to put water for birds; having a compost pit in society; Uttarakhand government during preparation for Kumbh used old tyres to build a road which is highly durable than those of charcoal; Japan has made newspapers which grows in plants when planted in soils and they are already made from recycled paper. Nowadays, menstrual cups can be used instead of sanitary pads, which reduces period waste. Also, there are a few reverse vending machines placed in CP where you can put used bottles, and in return, it generates a 'thank you' coupon.

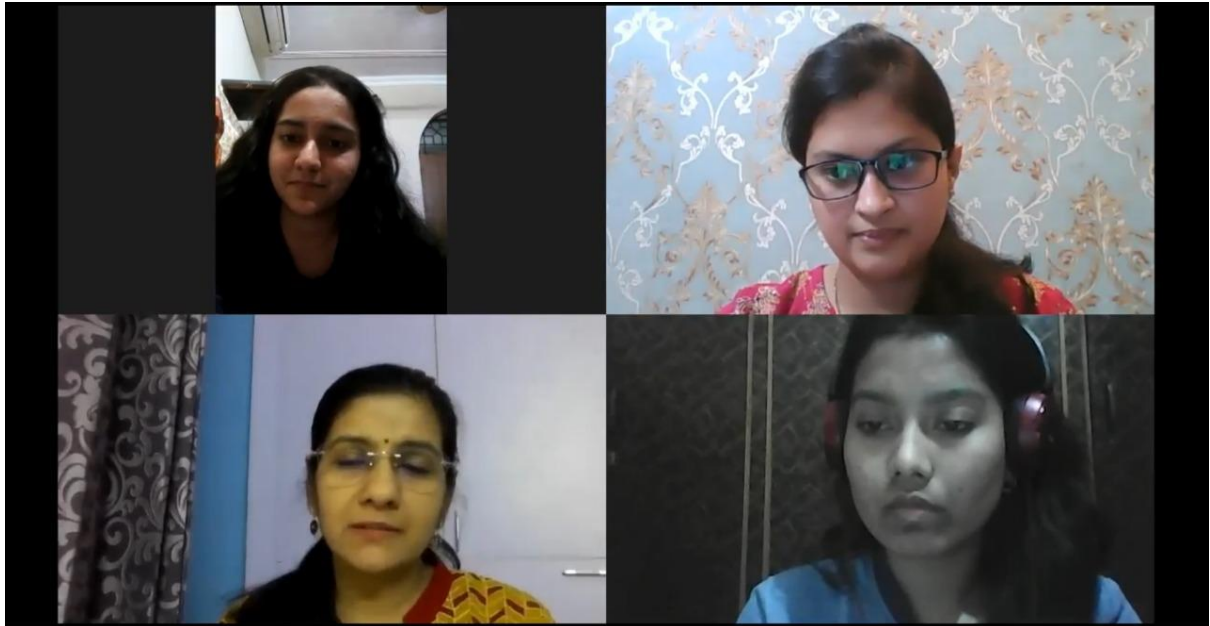

### **Sanitary Napkins Donation Drive**

The Community Connect Cell of Delhi Metropolitan Education organised a donation drive on the International Day of Charity from September 1st, 2021, to September 10th, 2021. The COVID-19 pandemic has affected the lives of some of the most vulnerable communities across the country. This program was organised to cushion the impact of the crisis and ensure access to the essentials for all people. It was also organised to help poor people and those in need under the government scheme Scheme for Adolescent Girls (SAG).

It was organised in the college, and many of our faculty and students took part in and donated to this donation drive. These donations were in the form of old/worn clothes, medicines, nutritional supplements (calcium, vitamins etc.), sanitary napkins, masks, sanitisers, and school essentials such as bags, water bottles, shoes, slippers, and non-perishable food items. The donation boxes were kept in the college reception area, so it would be easy for anyone to have access.

And after the 10-day donation drive was over, these donations were donated to Goonj, a non-governmental organisation headquartered in New Delhi, India, which undertakes disaster relief, humanitarian aid and community development in parts of 23 states across India.

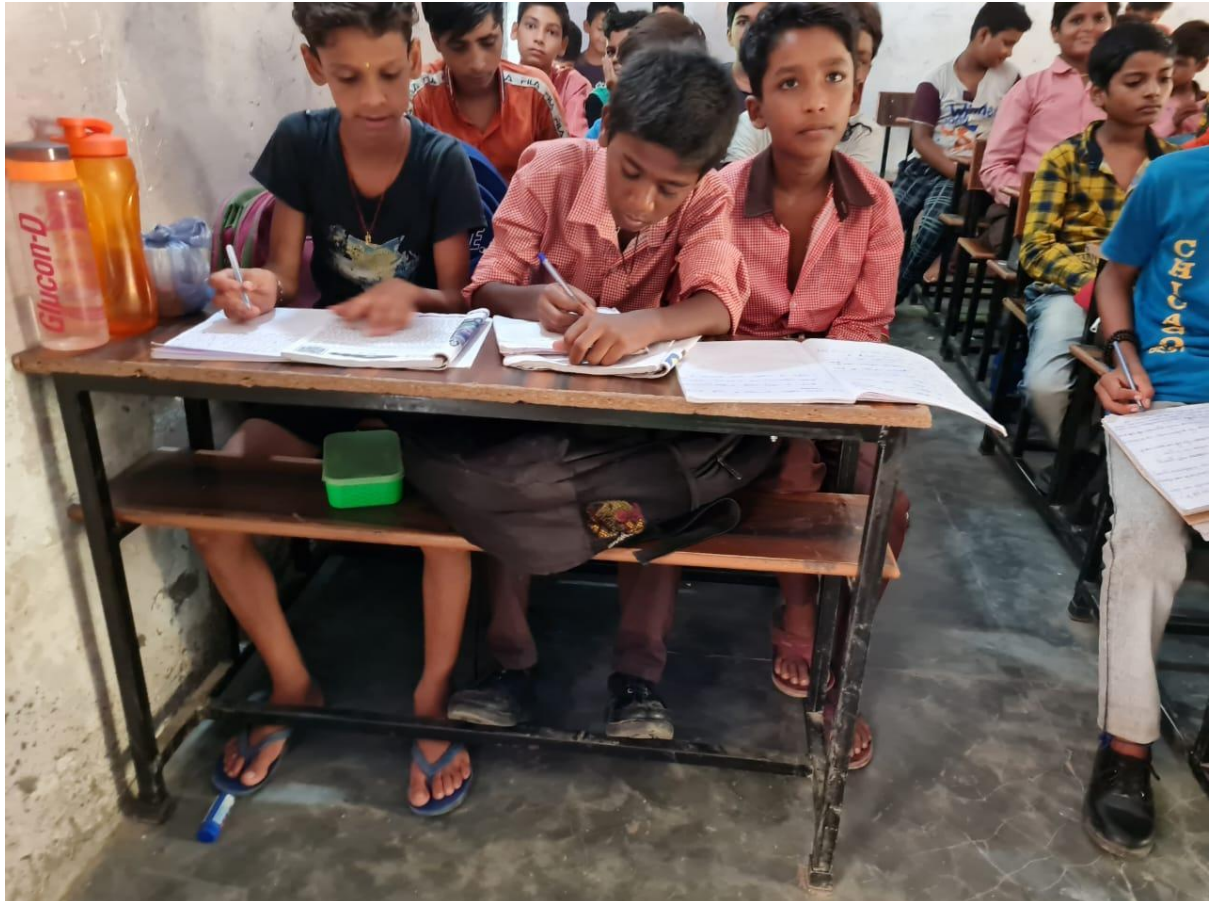
